Proceedings:

1. Approval for Appointment of New Staff Members

The Governing Body reviewed the requirement for appointment of additional teaching and non-teaching staff members for the effective conduct of academic, administrative, and institutional activities. The department-wise staff requirements, workload distribution, student strength, and institutional needs were examined in detail.

After thorough discussion and evaluation, the Governing Body approved the appointment of new teaching and non-teaching staff members as per institutional requirements and recommendations of the selection committee.

2. Approval of Promotion and Increment of staff members

After evaluating the performance, experience, qualifications, and eligibility criteria of the staff members, the Governing Body approved an increment ranging from 10% to 20% for all the staff members based on their performance and institutional contribution.

The Governing Body also approved promotions for eligible staff members as per institutional norms and applicable regulations.

Further, considering the departmental requirements and institutional needs, the Governing Body approved a special increment for the staff members of the Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) department.

3. Analysis of BE, M.Tech and MBA Results

The Governing Body reviewed the academic performance and examination results of BE, M.Tech, and MBA programs in detail. The results were analyzed based on various academic parameters such as overall pass percentage, distinctions, first class, second class, subject-wise performance, and department-wise academic progress.

After detailed deliberations, the Governing Body appreciated the efforts of the faculty members in maintaining academic standards and emphasized the need for continuous academic monitoring and improvement measures. The Governing Body suggested conducting remedial classes, mentoring sessions, special coaching, and additional academic support activities to enhance student performance and improve overall academic outcomes.

4. Approval of budget estimate for the financial year.

5. Approval for Applying for Establishment of Research Centre in CSE Department

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for applying for establishment of a Research Centre in the Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) department in order to strengthen research activities, innovation, consultancy, and academic development within the institution. The availability of qualified faculty members, research publications, laboratory facilities, computing infrastructure, and other academic resources required for establishing the research centre were examined in detail.

After thorough discussion and evaluation, the Governing Body approved the proposal for applying for establishment of a Research Centre in the CSE department as per the norms and guidelines of the university.

6. Approval for Correction in the Name of the Trust

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for correction in the name of the Trust in institutional and statutory records. It was noted that the existing name recorded in AICTE documents as “Sharnbasveshwara Vidya Vardhak Sangha” differs from the name appearing in the Trust PAN records as “Sharanabasaweshwar Vidya Vardhak Sangha.” The mismatch in spelling was causing difficulties in processing and release of FDR and other official financial and administrative transactions.

After thorough discussion and verification of the relevant records and supporting documents, the Governing Body approved the correction of the Trust name from “Sharnbasveshwara Vidya Vardhak Sangha” to “Sharanabasaweshwar Vidya Vardhak Sangha” in all records.

7. Approval for Change in Nomenclature of M.Tech Program

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for change in the nomenclature of the M.Tech postgraduate program in the records of AICTE for Lingaraj Appa Engineering College. It was noted that the existing nomenclature in AICTE records is mentioned as “VLSI and Embedded System Design,” whereas the nomenclature in the existing VTU records is “VLSI Design and Embedded Systems.” The mismatch in nomenclature was discussed in detail considering the need for uniformity in academic and statutory records.

After thorough discussion and verification of the relevant records, the Governing Body approved the proposal for change in nomenclature of the M.Tech program in AICTE records from “VLSI and Embedded System Design” to “VLSI Design and Embedded Systems” as per the VTU records and applicable guidelines.

8. Approval for Change in the Name of the Institution

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for change in the name of the institution in order to ensure uniformity and correctness in institutional and statutory records. It was noted that the existing name of the institution recorded as “LINGARAJAPPA ENGINEERING COLLEGE, at Survey No. 25/1, Gornalli, Bidar” is proposed to be changed to “LINGARAJ APPA ENGINEERING COLLEGE, Gornalli, Bidar.” The matter was discussed in detail considering the requirements of official documentation, regulatory compliance, and institutional identity.

After thorough discussion and verification of the relevant records and supporting documents, the Governing Body approved the proposal for change in the name of the institution from “LINGARAJAPPA ENGINEERING COLLEGE” to “LINGARAJ APPA ENGINEERING COLLEGE” as per the prescribed norms and guidelines of the concerned statutory authorities.

9. Approval to Apply for NBA Accreditation for ECE Department

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for applying for accreditation of the

Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE) department by the National Board of Accreditation. The importance of NBA accreditation in enhancing academic quality, outcome-based education, institutional credibility, and continuous improvement in teaching-learning processes was discussed in detail.

The Governing Body examined the preparedness of the department with respect to faculty qualifications, laboratory facilities, infrastructure, academic performance, student outcomes, and compliance with NBA norms and guidelines.

After thorough discussion and evaluation, the Governing Body approved the proposal to apply for NBA accreditation for the ECE department .

10. Approval for Purchase of Cadence Software

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for purchase of Cadence software for academic, laboratory, and research activities in the institution. The requirement was examined in detail considering the importance of advanced software tools for VLSI design, simulation, electronic circuit analysis, research work, and skill development among students and faculty members.

After thorough discussion and evaluation, the Governing Body approved the purchase of Cadence software as per institutional purchase procedures and budget provisions.

11. Approval for New Entrance Gate for College Campus

The Governing Body reviewed the proposal for construction of a new entrance gate for the college campus in order to improve the infrastructure, security, accessibility, and overall appearance of the institution. The requirement was discussed in detail considering the increasing movement of students, staff members, visitors, and vehicles within the campus premises.

After thorough discussion and evaluation, the Governing Body approved the proposal for construction of a new entrance gate for the college campus as per institutional requirements and budget provisions.

12. Approval of fee structure for the Academic Year 2026-27.
